

Drexel Summer Mentorship – July 2006

RULES & REGULATIONS

We at Drexel want the summer mentorship program to be fun and rewarding for all participants, but it won't be fun unless everyone remains safe. To that end, we insist that all participants abide by the following rules and regulations. Failure to do so may result in dismissal from the program.

- Students are not to go anywhere alone.
- Students are to remain on the Drexel/UPenn campuses (specifically, you are not to go outside the area bounded by Powelton Street to the North, 38th Street to the West, Walnut Street to the South, and 30th Street to the East) at all times unless accompanied by a Drexel chaperon (this chaperone must be approved by one of the Resident Advisors or the Program Director, Amy Campell).
- During scheduled working hours (9AM-5PM Monday through Friday) students must keep their mentor informed of their whereabouts at all times.
- During non-working hours students must keep their Mentor, the Resident Advisors, or the Program Director informed of their whereabouts at all times.
- **Curfews:** On weeknights (Sun-Thur) students must be in East Hall by 10:00 PM and in their room by 11:00 PM. On weekend nights (Fri. & Sat.) students must be in East Hall by 12:15 AM and in their room by 12:30 AM. Exception: some group activities might keep us out past 10 PM on weeknights.
- All scheduled activities are mandatory. Please alert a Resident Advisor or the Program Director if you are ill or have a conflict due to a religious service.
- Students are not permitted to have a vehicle during the summer mentorship program.
- Visitors or guests are not allowed during the summer mentorship program unless previously authorized by the Program Director.
- The use of alcohol or other drugs is not permitted anywhere, anytime.
- *Caution:* Drexel is an urban area and students are advised to exercise appropriate caution, especially at night. Be alert at all times and know where you are going (see items above relating to curfews, boundaries, and chaperones).
- Room keys and nametags should be with students at all times. If not, students risk being locked out of the residence hall. Students who lose their keys will be charged directly. Please be mindful of cleaning up after using communal areas such as the kitchen, bathrooms and lounge.
- The following are also prohibited in or around the residence halls: (a) use or possession of weapons or pyrotechnics; (b) use or possession of candles, flammable substances, or any open flame; (c) television; (d) pets and changing furniture from one room or area to another; (e) use of high wattage electrical appliance which could pose a fire hazard such as hot plates, toasters, toaster ovens, popcorn poppers, and sun lamps. Refrigerators and microwave ovens are acceptable for use in student rooms and kitchens.
- The University reserves the right to enter residents' rooms for the purpose of investigations, inspections, repairs, or in cases of clear emergency. The University recognizes its responsibility to respect the right of residents not to have their privacy unreasonably disturbed.

- Room damage will be billed to students directly, so students are advised to take care of their living area.
- Musical instruments may not be played in the dorm room.
- Fighting and pranks are not permitted.
- No eating or drinking in the laboratories.
- No smoking within campus buildings.
- No inappropriate behavior.
- No inappropriate language.
- Students are required to conduct themselves in a manner conducive to a positive academic and learning environment. The program expects each participant to treat all fellow students with respect and courtesy.
