FRESHMAN CHECKLIST

To expedite the application process, submit right away:

Undergraduate Admissions Application

Use your full legal name (no nicknames, please) on all items submitted. You must include your Social Security number on your application if you wish to be considered for financial aid. **You may only submit one application.** If you need to change your major or co-op selection after submitting your application, please contact Admissions at enroll@drexel.edu or 1-800-2-DREXEL; international students may dial 1-215-895-2400.

Submit before admission deadline:

Essay

All applicants must submit a 1–2 page essay online at www.drexel.edu/apply/essay. We do not accept essays submitted on paper.

Westphal College of Media Arts & Design applicants: Relate your essay topic to your interest in your intended major. If you are applying to an accelerated degree program in the Westphal College, your essay topic should relate to your selected major and indicate why you are a good candidate for the program.

Accelerated degree applicants (except BA/BS/MD and BA/BS/JD): You should describe the factors that influenced your decision to pursue an accelerated degree in your chosen profession.

- BA/BS/JD applicants should refer to www.drexel.edu/apply/bsjd for specific essay topics.

- BA/BS/MD applicants should refer to the College of Medicine Supplemental Application at www.drexel.edu/apply/bsmd for specific essay topics.

- BS/PhD applicants must also describe any research involvement.

- BS/MS in Psychology applicants should provide a description of the decision-making process which led them to pursue this degree program.

All other applicants: You may write about why you are interested in your choice of major or you may write on any subject you choose.

Transcripts

Official transcripts must be sent directly from your high school to Drexel. You are required to submit transcripts from each high school attended. A transcript request form is included for your use.

Letters of Recommendation

Two letters of recommendation are required. At least one must be completed by a high school counselor. Forms are available on page 9. Recommendations on official letterhead will also be accepted. Letters of recommendation may also be submitted electronically at www.drexel.edu/apply/recommend.

If you are applying to the BA/BS/MD accelerated degree program, your letters must be from a high school counselor and a science teacher.

Standardized Test Scores

You must take either the SAT or ACT and request that the results be forwarded to Admissions. All students should use the following codes to send score reports to Drexel: SAT 2194 or ACT 3556.

Portfolio (Fashion Design and Graphic Design applicants only)

You are required to submit a sample of your creative work with a maximum of 12 images of drawings, paintings, photographs, or other visual materials or a website. Briefly explain the context within which you created the work. All work submitted becomes part of the application and will not be returned. Your portfolio must be submitted electronically to www.highschoolportfolios.com.

WESTPHAL COLLEGE OF MEDIA ARTS & DESIGN: EARLY ACTION

Applicants with exceptional academic qualifications who have decided that Westphal College is their top choice can apply early and receive an official decision sooner in the admission process. A **complete application is due December 1. If you are admitted, you have until May 1 to fully explore Drexel and confirm your intention to enroll.** This is a nonbinding Early Action program. The regular admission deadline for Westphal programs is March 1.

Essay

All applicants (except Nursing ACE and RN-BSN degree completion applicants) must submit a 1–2 page essay online at www.drexel.edu/apply/essay. We do not accept essays submitted on paper.

Westphal College of Media Arts & Design applicants: Relate your essay topic to your interest in your intended major.

All other applicants: You may write about why you are interested in your choice of major or you may write on any subject you choose.

Transcripts

Official transcripts must be sent directly from your college to Drexel. The transcript should include all courses in progress. You are required to submit transcripts from each college attended. If you have completed fewer than 24 credits at the time of application, you must also submit an official copy of your high school transcript. A transcript request form is included for your use. Radiologic Technology program applicants are required to submit a high school transcript regardless of the number of completed college credits.

Standardized Test Scores

If you have completed 24 or more college credits you are not required to submit standardized test scores. Otherwise, you must take either the SAT or ACT and request that the results be forwarded to Admissions. All students should use the following codes to send score reports to Drexel: SAT 2194 or ACT 3556.

Portfolio (Fashion Design and Graphic Design applicants only)

You are required to submit a sample of your creative work with a maximum of 12 images of drawings, paintings, photographs, or other visual materials or a website. Briefly explain the context within which you created the work. All work submitted becomes part of the application and will not be returned. Additional Requirements

International Admissions

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS CHECKLIST

❑ Transcripts

All international applicants are required to submit an official academic record (with notarized English translation) from every secondary or post secondary school attended. A transcript is official only when it is sent directly from an institution to Admissions, or when it is officially signed, stamped in color, and sealed.

❑ Transfer Students

International transfer students must submit a course syllabus to receive relevant credits.

❑ Standardized Test Scores

All international applicants (except as indicated below) may take the SAT, ACT, TOEFL, or IELTS if the student's native language is not English. International applicants who submit the SAT together with either the TOEFL or IELTS are considered more competitive candidates. Results must be forwarded to Admissions.

❑ Proof of Financial Responsibility

For students who are not U.S. citizens or permanent residents, proof of financial responsibility is required to obtain a student visa. All documents must be notarized and written in English. You must submit the Financial Certification Form, which can be downloaded at www.drexel.edu/em/undergrad/pdf/fincert.pdf, and at least one of the following documents:

- A current official bank letter in either your name or your sponsor's name. The signature of the bank official must attest to the amount of funds available in the account.
- A non-Drexel scholarship award letter in your name. Enclose a signed letter or affidavit of support giving full details regarding the promise of support, and the specific amount of money in U.S. dollars.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS, PERMANENT RESIDENTS, AND U.S. CITIZENS BORN ABROAD

❑ Transcripts

Nursing ACE, RN-BSN degree completion, and Radiologic Technology applicants: You must have transcripts evaluated by one of the following three agencies if you received your degree or attended an institution outside of the United States:

- International Consultants of Delaware, www.icdel.com
- Educational Credential Evaluators (ECE), www.ece.org

❑ Standardized Tests

All Nursing ACE, BSN Co-op, and RN-BSN applicants: Applicants born outside of the United States are required to take the TOEFL

examination. Applicants can be waived from the TOEFL if the applicant was born on a U.S. military base or has completed four years of high school and has a high school diploma from the United States, Australia, New Zealand, the United Kingdom, Canada, or Ireland.

Passing test scores:

- TOEFL iBT: Minimum combined score of 79 with a 26 score or higher in the speaking section.

OR

- TOEFL paper-based exam: Total score of 550 and the Test of Spoken English (TSE) exam with a minimum score of 55.

Biomedical Engineering and Engineering Majors

- Four years of college-prep mathematics including algebra I and II, geometry/trigonometry, and pre-calculus
- One year of chemistry (with lab)
- One year of physics (with lab)

Nursing and Health Professions Majors

- Three years of mathematics (algebra I and II and geometry)
- Two years of a laboratory science (biology, chemistry, or physics)

ADVANCED PLACEMENT CREDIT

Drexel recognizes the significance of superior scores earned by incoming freshmen on the Advanced Placement (AP) examinations administered by the College Board. Your performance in AP courses may accelerate progress in your degree program. If you have received a score of 5 on any AP examination, you may elect one of the following options with the approval of your academic advisor:

- Be placed in an advanced course in that AP subject
- Substitute another course or credit-bearing activity in its place
- Waive the course and apply the course credit to meet graduation requirements

Students accepted into an accelerated degree program may, with the approval of their academic advisor, waive selected courses in which AP scores of 4 and 5 have been earned and apply the course credits to meet graduation requirements.

Assessment of qualifying AP credits for placement or credit will be completed after confirmation and matriculation. The assessment will be completed by the student's academic advisor, not by Admissions.
