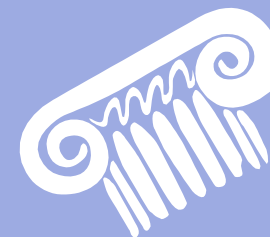

By working with small group facilitators, peer critique, and individual mentors, students will prepare and revise their applications throughout the summer, readying them for fall deadlines.

### Eligibility

Students must identify national awards that they wish to apply for and confirm eligibility.

All workshop participants will solicit the support of a faculty mentor to work with them on the research portion of their proposals.
