<p>The Institute for Pure and Applied Mathematics (IPAM) Research in Industrial Projects for Students</p>	<p>In collaboration with Microsoft Research Asia (MSRA), ten U.S. students and ten Chinese students will work on cross-cultural teams on 5 projects, each sponsored by an MSRA research group. The dates and basic format of the program are the same as RIPS-LA. English is the only language required for participation. U.S. citizens and permanent residents are eligible to apply through IPAM; the application form will allow you to indicate your interest in RIPS-Beijing. <p>Boren Undergraduate Scholarships (NSEP)</p>	<p>The National Security Education Program (NSEP) is a unique scholarship opportunity for U.S. undergraduates to study abroad. Created in 1991, NSEP awards scholarships to American students for study of world regions critical to U.S. interests (including Africa, Asia, Central & Eastern Europe, Eurasia, Latin America & the Caribbean, and the Middle East). The countries of Western Europe, Canada, Australia, and New Zealand are excluded. <p>Carnegie Endowment for International Peace Junior Fellows Program</p>	<p>Junior Fellows provide research assistance to Associates working on the Carnegie Endowment's projects. Junior Fellows have the opportunity to conduct research for books, participate in meetings with high-level officials, contribute to congressional testimony and organize briefings attended by scholars, activists, journalists and government officials. Marshall Scholarship	Marshall Scholarships finance young Americans of high ability to study for a degree in the United Kingdom. At least forty Scholars are selected each year to study either at graduate or occasionally undergraduate level at an UK institution in any field of study. DAAD - Undergraduate Scholarship	Highly qualified undergraduate students are invited to apply for scholarships funding study, senior thesis research and/or internships in Germany. The goal of this program is to support study abroad in Germany and at German universities. Preference will be given to students whose projects or programs are based at and organized by a German university. Thomas Pickering Foreign Affairs Undergraduate Fellowship	The fellowship award includes tuition, room, board, and mandatory fees during the junior and senior years of college and during the first year of graduate study with reimbursement for books and one round-trip travel. The Fellow must commit to pursuing a graduate degree in international studies at one of the graduate schools identified by the program. <p>Freeman Awards for Study in Asia (Freeman-ASIA)</p>	<p>The primary goal of Freeman-ASIA, an IIE-administered program generously supported by the Freeman Foundation, is to increase the number of American undergraduates to study in East and Southeast Asia, by providing students with the information and the financial assistance they will need. Awardees will be expected to share their experiences with their home campus, to encourage study abroad by others and to spread understanding of Asia in their home communities.
