### **Charlotte Alletag Commuter Lounge**

The Commuter Lounge, located in the lower level of Creese Student Center, is a place for commuters to gather between classes. The Commuter Lounge has a big-screen television, a microwave, and a refrigerator, in addition to sofas and tables for socializing with friends.

### **Lockers**

Lockers are available for commuter students throughout Drexel's campus. These locations are:

- Greenawalt Student Development Center: Located in the lower level of the Creese Student Center, lockers become available on the first day of each term for \$5/term and can be rented online at [www.drexel.edu/oca/commuters](http://www.drexel.edu/oca/commuters).
- Hagerty Library: Located in the basement level of the library, these lockers become available on the first day of each term at a rate of \$5/term.
- Daskalakis Athletic Center: Lockers in the DAC become available on the first day of each term at a rate of \$50 or \$75/term or daily at no charge.
- Nesbitt Hall: Fashion and Interior Design students in Westphal College of Media Arts & Design may get lockers in Nesbitt Hall; for more information please contact the college.

### **Drexel Campus Dining**

## **Parking**

There are approximately 1,750 off-street parking spaces provided by Drexel Parking Services. These are located in a multi-level garage and 15 permit surface lots. Daily parking is also available in the parking garage. To obtain permit parking, students must visit [www.drexel.edu/parking](http://www.drexel.edu/parking) to register their vehicle. ### ***Handicapped Parking***

Individuals using handicapped parking spaces must have either HP or DV license plates, or an official placard issued by the licensing state. In addition, a Drexel University Disabled Parking Permit must be obtained. Disabled Parking Permits are available at the Parking Services Office.

### ***SEPTA***

Drexel is within walking distance of Amtrak's 30th Street Station and has a number of bus stops on campus. Additionally, subway and trolley stations are located at 30th, 33rd, and 34th and Market Streets.
