You must include your Social Security Number on your application if you wish to be considered for financial aid. **You may only submit one application.** If you need to change your major or co-op selection after submitting your application, please contact Admissions at enroll@drexel.edu or 1-215-895-2400.

Submit before admission deadline:

Essay

All applicants must submit a 250- to 500- word essay online at www.drexel.edu/apply/essay. We do not accept essays submitted on paper.

Westphal College of Media Arts & Design applicants: Relate your essay topic to your interest in your intended major. If you are applying to an accelerated degree program in the Westphal College, your essay topic should relate to your selected major and indicate why you are a good candidate for the program.

Accelerated degree applicants (except BA/BS/MD and BA/BS/JD): You should describe the factors that influenced your decision to pursue an accelerated degree in your chosen profession.

- **BA/BS/JD applicants:** Qualified applicants will be requested to submit an additional essay.
- **BA/BS/MD applicants** should refer to the College of Medicine Supplemental Application at www.drexel.edu/apply/bsmd for specific essay topics.
- **BS/PhD applicants** must also describe any research involvement.
- **BS/MS in Psychology applicants:** Qualified applicants will be requested to submit an additional essay.

Custom-Designed major applicants: Qualified applicants will be requested to submit additional admission materials.

All other applicants: You may write about why you are interested in your choice of major or you may write on any subject you choose.

Transcripts

Official transcripts must be sent directly from your high school to Drexel. You are required to submit transcripts from each high school attended. Transcripts must reflect 9th, 10th, and 11th grade coursework and grades earned. A transcript request form is included for your use.

Letters of Recommendation

Two letters of recommendation are required. At least one must be completed by a high school counselor. If you are applying to the BA/BS/MD accelerated degree program, your letters must be from a high school counselor and a science teacher. Forms are available on pages 7 and 8. Recommendations on official letterhead will also be accepted. Letters of recommendation may also be submitted electronically at www.drexel.edu/apply/recommend.

Standardized Test Scores

You must take either the SAT or ACT and request that the results be forwarded to Admissions. All students should use the following codes to send score reports to Drexel: SAT 2194 or ACT 3556. Drexel encourages you to submit scores each time you take the SAT or ACT test.

Portfolio (Fashion Design and Graphic Design applicants only)

You are required to submit a sample of your creative work with a maximum of 12 images of drawings, paintings, photographs, or other visual materials or a website. All work submitted becomes part of the application and will not be returned. Your portfolio must be submitted electronically to www.highschoolportfolios.com.

Audition (Dance applicants only)

Dance applicants are required to audition. For more information, visit www.drexel.edu/westphal/dance.

Early Decision Forms (Westphal College of Media Arts & Design)

Students applying for Early Decision to Westphal College are required to complete College Board's CSS Profile. If your parents are separated, divorced, or were never married, you'll also need to submit the CSS Non-Custodial Profile. Both forms can be found at <https://profileonline.collegeboard.com>. Early Decision candidates must also complete the Early Decision Contract, which can be found at www.drexel.edu/undergrad/apply/earlydecision. All forms are to be filed by November 15.

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

You do not need to wait to be accepted to apply for financial aid. To be considered for need-based financial aid, you'll need to file the FAFSA. You can complete the form online at www.fafsa.gov; be sure to list Drexel's code: 003256. The FAFSA can be started as early as January 1; however, for full financial aid consideration, you should file by February 15. Students who submit the FAFSA by this date will be eligible for the \$1,000 Early FAFSA Award.

BA/BS/MD accelerated degree applicants will also need to complete the College of Medicine Supplemental Application available online at www.drexel.edu/apply/bsmd.

Submit before admission deadline:

Essay

All applicants (except Nursing ACE) **must submit a 250- to 500- word essay online at www.drexel.edu/apply/essay.** We do not accept essays submitted on paper.

Westphal College of Media Arts & Design applicants: Relate your essay topic to your interest in your intended major.

Custom-Designed major applicants: Qualified applicants will be requested to submit additional admission materials.

All other applicants: You may write about why you are interested in your choice of major or you may write on any subject you choose.

Transcripts

Official transcripts must be sent directly from your college to Drexel. The transcript should include all courses in progress. You are required to submit transcripts from each college attended. If you have completed fewer than 24 credits at the time of application, you must also submit an official copy of your high school transcript. In most circumstances, a high school transcript can be considered if the graduation date is no more than two years from the date of enrollment at Drexel. A transcript request form is included for your use. Radiologic Technology program applicants are required to submit a high school transcript regardless of the number of completed college credits.

Standardized Test Scores

If you have completed 24 or more college credits you are not required to submit standardized test scores. Otherwise, you must take either the SAT or ACT and request that the results be forwarded to Admissions. All students should use the following codes to send score reports to Drexel: SAT 2194 or ACT 3556. Test scores are valid up to two years from the test date. Drexel encourages you to submit scores each time you take the SAT or ACT.

Portfolio (Fashion Design and Graphic Design applicants only)

You are required to submit a sample of your creative work with a maximum of 12 images of drawings, paintings, photographs, or other visual materials or a website. All work submitted becomes part of the application and will not be returned. Your portfolio must be submitted electronically to www.highschoolportfolios.com.

Audition (Dance applicants only)

Dance applicants are required to audition. For more information, visit www.drexel.edu/westphal/dance.

Additional Requirements

Invasive Cardiovascular Technology applicants are required to submit a copy of their ARRT certification.

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

You do not need to wait to be accepted to apply for financial aid. To be considered for need-based financial aid, you'll need to file the FAFSA. The FAFSA can be started as early as January 1; however, for full financial aid consideration, you should file by February 15. Students who submit the FAFSA by this date will be eligible for the \$1,000 Early FAFSA Award.

International Admissions

INTERNATIONAL STUDENT CHECKLIST

❑ Transcripts

All international applicants are required to submit an official academic record (with notarized English translation) from every secondary or post-secondary school attended. A transcript is official only when it is sent directly from an institution to Admissions, or when it is officially signed, stamped in color, and sealed. Transcripts must reflect 9th, 10th, and 11th grade coursework and grades earned for freshman applicants. Transfer applicants must submit a course syllabus to receive relevant credits.

❑ Standardized Test Scores

International freshman applicants whose native language is English or who attend high school in the United States are required to take the SAT or ACT. Students may choose to submit the TOEFL or IELTS in addition to the SAT or ACT.

All other international freshman applicants may take the SAT, ACT, TOEFL, or IELTS. Drexel strongly prefers that applicants submit both the SAT and either the TOEFL or IELTS; candidates who do so will be considered more competitive.

International transfer applicants must take the TOEFL or IELTS unless the applicant has completed 24 college-level credits, including English Composition I and II and earning a grade of C or better from a regionally accredited institution in the United States.

Results must be forwarded to Admissions. Drexel encourages you to submit scores each time you take these exams. All students should use the following codes to send score reports to Drexel: SAT and TOEFL 2194 and ACT 3556.

❑ Proof of Financial Responsibility

For students who are not U.S. citizens or permanent residents, proof of financial responsibility showing sufficient financial support for education in the United States is required to obtain a student visa. Drexel prefers that you submit the following materials with your complete application. All documents must be notarized and written in English:

- I-20 Application Form, www.drexel.edu/apply/i20form
- A current official bank letter in either your name or your sponsor's name. The signature of the bank official must attest to the amount of funds available in the account.
- A non-Drexel scholarship award letter in your name. Enclose a signed letter or affidavit of support giving full details regarding the promise of support, and the specific amount of money in U.S. dollars.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS, PERMANENT RESIDENTS, AND U.S. CITIZENS BORN ABROAD

❑ Transcripts

Nursing ACE and Radiologic Technology applicants: You must have transcripts evaluated by one of the following three agencies if you received your degree or attended an institution outside of the United States:

- World Education Services (WES), www.wes.org
- International Consultants of Delaware, www.icdel.com
- Educational Credential Evaluators (ECE), www.ece.org

❑ Standardized Tests

All Nursing ACE and BSN Co-op applicants: Applicants born outside of the United States are required to take the TOEFL examination. Results must be forwarded to Admissions. Drexel encourages you to submit scores each time you take this exam. All students should use the following code to send score reports to Drexel: TOEFL 2194.

Passing test scores:

- TOEFL iBT: Minimum combined score of 79 with a 26 score or higher in the speaking section.
- OR
- TOEFL paper-based exam: Total score of 550 and the Test of Spoken English (TSE) exam with a minimum score of 55.

The TOEFL can be waived if the applicant:

- Was born on a U.S. military base

OR

- Has completed four years of high school and received a high school diploma in the United States, Australia, New Zealand, the United Kingdom, Canada, or Ireland.

Students who meet the above requirements and wish to request a waiver of the TOEFL exam must submit a copy of their transcript(s) reflecting all four years of attendance and graduation date. Transcripts may be sent via mail, email, or fax. Students may send emails to enroll@drexel.edu; faxes can be sent to 215-895-1285. ADVANCED PLACEMENT CREDIT

Drexel recognizes the significance of superior scores earned by incoming freshmen on Advanced Placement (AP) examinations administered by the College Board. Consideration of AP performance may accelerate a student's progress in his or her respective degree program. Students should arrange to have their scores sent directly to Drexel University from the College Board — the code is 2194. ADMISSION PROCESS

BA/BS/MD applicants must also visit www.drexel.edu/apply/bsmd to complete the College of Medicine Supplemental Application. **BA/BS/MD applications are due by November 15.** All other application materials are due to Undergraduate Admissions by December 1. Transfer students are not eligible for these programs.
