# Student Empowerment & Reflection

Interestingly, as part of an evaluation of senior student teachers equipped with iPad's during a clinical education course, students reported that although they used the iPad for social media during course lectures, it helped them to remain focused during class time. Students thought of such web browsing as analogous to doodling on paper (Geist, Dec 2011).

The National Educational Technology Plan 2010 report said schools:

".. must be more than information factories; they must be incubators of exploration and invention. Educators must be more than information experts; they must be collaborators — in learning, seeking new knowledge and constantly acquiring new skills alongside of their students. Students must be fully engaged in school — intellectually, socially, and emotionally (Colvin, 2013, p. 64).
