Policy Advocacy

Public Policy:

The process of making decisions about how public dollars should be spent.

Policy Advocacy:

A big focus of ASAN, analyzing the history and what the community needs now to put forward proposals to change things for the better.



Participatory Policymaking

Making sure that the people impacted by a policy have a hand in shaping it.





Policymaking and Research

Need research to craft effective policy Need research to know how much different policy options might cost Need research to predict how well they can be expected to work

Need research to maximize different outcomes Need research to balance competing priorities

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Issues with Autism Research

Only 2% of research spending on autism looks at autistic people across the lifespan--adolescents, adults, and elders.

48% of autism research funding looked at basic biology and what causes autism

Autism research dollars are concentrated at NIH, focus on traditional basic science



Participatory Research

Members of the community being studied share power with researchers

Work together to pick the research topic, form research questions, design the study, analyze data, and discuss the results

Must take autistic people seriously as part of the research process

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Changing the Policy Process


Proxy Caller System Encouraging people with disabilities to run for office Equipping self-advocates to participate in the public comment process
