As a Drexel student at BCC, your options are unique and your possibilities are endless.



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
Learn from the best faculty.

Campus Life

In the same way that you get the best of all worlds academically, you also get the best of both campuses. Drexel at BCC students are eligible for all Drexel campus activities and organizations (with the exception of NCAA Division I athletics), as well as all those offered by Burlington County College.

At Drexel that means:

- More than 300 student clubs and organizations offering everything from professional networking opportunities to the chance to publish your poetry.
- Enhanced programs like the Baiada Center for Entrepreneurship, which provides resources for future business leaders, and RePlay, Drexel's collaborative computer gaming lab.

- Cultural events like big-name concerts and comedy shows, dance and theater performances, and pretty much anything else you can imagine from a big school in a big city.

At Burlington County College you'll find:

- Facilities designed with commuter students in mind. When you don't have a dorm room to go back to between classes, it's nice to have access to lounges with plasma-screen TVs, pool tables, and snack options.
- Off-campus field trips to cities throughout the region for major cultural events at big discounts.
- On-campus events offering everything from student clubs to laser tag to drive-in movies.

The co-op experience.

Seven of our majors participate in Drexel Co-op (see the table on the facing page). This is a renowned program that allows students to work for six-month periods in the process of earning their degrees. Co-ops are not internships — they're full-time professional positions that provide real career experience in the field of your major. By the time you graduate you'll have a résumé that will make you the envy of your peers.

You can choose from over 1,500 employers in 33 states and 40 international locations. Recent Drexel students have completed co-ops with companies including Lockheed Martin, GlaxoSmithKline, and Microsoft.

Co-op Preparation

The idea of choosing from among hundreds of potential co-ops in locations ranging from South Jersey to India might seem overwhelming, but we've got you covered. Through Drexel's Steinbright Career Development Center, all co-op students take Co-op 101, a course that provides information on all steps of the job process, from résumé writing to interviewing. You'll also have access to advising and workshops to give you an insider's edge.

Career Advising

Drexel at BCC students can meet with a Career Services Coordinator at our Mount Laurel campus during open office hours, held at least twice a week during each academic term. Services include:

- Personalized résumé development and critiques
- One-on-one interview preparation guidance and mock interviews
- Customized job search and internship search assistance

Also, take advantage of in-person and virtual workshops conducted throughout the year covering topics such as résumé writing, interviewing, and job searching.






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Drexel Co-op Cycle


