

2019 Scholar Application

The Dornsife Global Development Scholars program is a nationally and internationally recognized capacity-building program for bridging gaps between scientific research, development practice, and applied problem-solving in the context of improving global health.

This program is based on a mentorship model that allows students of all majors and educational levels to work alongside a major international non-government organization (INGO)—World Vision International—on humanitarian, global health and international development initiatives related to: water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH), maternal and child health, health education, social marketing, community engagement, monitoring and evaluation, economic development, and a host of other areas related to promoting and improving health and development outcomes in developing countries. This opportunity allows students to gain an international experience working in rural parts of sub-Saharan Africa, Latin America and Southeast Asia from 3 to 6 months. Working closely with our World Vision International, the program provides support throughout the experience including pre-departure orientation and training, in-country housing arrangements for the duration of the international experience, airport transportation, project orientation, site visits and field-based experiences.

The Dornsife Global Development Scholars program is open to all graduate and undergraduate majors (at all levels) at Drexel; applications for coop and/or a summer international experience are strongly encouraged.

The Dornsife Global Development Scholars program provide students with generous funding to cover the associated costs of participation, including a scholarship to cover travel and in-field expenses, such as:

- Airfare to and from country
- In-country housing
- Monthly food stipend
- International health insurance
- Emergency evacuation insurance
- Communications expenses (local cell phone and/or occasional use of internet cafes)
- Visa expenses
- And other related costs

The Dornsife Global Development Scholars program prepares each and every scholar for international work through a required pre-departure training program. This training is held prior to travel and field work, as pre-departure training is essential for every outbound scholar. Dornsife Global Development Scholars are also expected to present findings and lessons learned upon their return back to the United States through a post-exit presentation or workshop. As a part of this scholarship program, Dornsife Global Development Scholars are required to participate in programming at least one term before the international experience begins; as well as reentry programming during the academic year after they return to the US. Specific details on the presentation, participation in all programming, and other expectations will be given during the Dornsife Global Development Scholars interest meetings and orientation.

2019 Scholar Application Application Instruction

Step 1

Review all background information about the Dornsife Global Development Scholars program, which can be found in the program description and on the Dornsife Global Development Scholars website (see: www.drexel.edu/dornsifescholars). On our website, be sure to review the diversity of work and field experiences that past Dornsife Global Development Scholars have had (from 2014-present), in rural parts of sub-Saharan Africa (see: http://drexel.edu/dornsife/global/dornsife-scholars/scholars/).

Step 2

Complete the Dornsife Global Development Scholars application by providing a response to all fields. On the application, be sure to select the theme/program areas that you are interested in (check all that apply). Save the file type as a PDF with the following title: "FirstnameLastname_DGDSapp" (e.g. IdrisRobinson_DGDSapp .pdf).

Step 3

Prepare the remaining supplemental application materials:

- Statement of Purpose: One-page statement of interest that describes (1) unique contributions you can make to World Vision given your skills and interests, (2) prior experiences working in diverse communities, and (3) specific ways working with World Vision WASH on global health initiatives relate to your future career goals. Save the file type as a PDF with the following title: "FirstnameLastname_SOP" (e.g. IdrisRobinson _SOP.pdf).
- <u>Transcripts:</u> Unofficial transcripts from current or most recent institution, or Fall 2018 term grades. Save the file type as a PDF with the following title: "FirstnameLastname_Trans" (e.g. IdrisRobinson Trans.pdf).
- Resume/Curriculum vitae (CV): CVs should be a maximum of 2 pages. Save the file type as a PDF with the following title: "FirstnameLastname_CV" (e.g. IdrisRobinson _CV.pdf).

Step 4

Applications are due by November 7, 2018. It is your responsibility to ensure that your submission contains a complete application and all of the necessary components. Although applications will be accepted on a rolling basis, priority will be given to applications received on or before November 7, 2018. Completed applications can be submitted by email, fax, mail, or dropped off to Idris Robinson using the following:

Note: This is a very competitive program. Completing the Dornsife Scholars application process does not guarantee placement. Additionally, in order to meet university requirements for co-op credit, an international experience, practicum, thesis or other academic requirements (if applicable), students must also abide by the application and registration requirements of Steinbright Career Development Center (for co-op), the Study Abroad international experience process, and seek approval from your advisor/department, college/school (if seeking credit in partial fulfillment of other academic requirements, such as practicum, thesis/dissertation research, etc.)



2019 Scholar Application Selection Process

Review 1

The Dornsife Global Development Scholars Selection Committee will review eligible applications in an attempt to match applicants with the needs of our World Vision International hosts based on the following:

- Demonstration of necessary experience, knowledge and skills;
- Ability to connect academic matriculation with the general needs of improving health outcomes in resource-limited communities;
- Expressed interest of international development as it relates to World Vision global health and WASH initiatives as described in personal statement; and
- Demonstrated understanding of the current state of global health and international development.

The Committee will then notify and arrange interviews with the applicant based on the specific opportunities available at World Vision. After the interview between the Committee and the candidate, the Committee will notify World Vision of the qualified applicants for logistics.

Review 2

World Vision International will review accepted applications and select the applicants best suited for the available World Vision project(s). If needed, the Dornsife Global Development Scholar Program Office will coordinate a Skype or conference call between World Vision and the applicant(s) before identifying the best match(es) for the available World Vision project(s). Students can expect that these meetings will consist of a brief conversation or meeting arranged at World Vision's discretion.

Review 3

The Dornsife Global Development Scholars Selection Committee will identify the matches between the accepted applicant's preferred projects and project interests (as identified on the student's application), and World Vision's list of preferred student matches (as identified in Review 2).

Final decisions on accepted applicants will be based on the matching criteria and overall best fit. <u>Decisions</u> will be announced in a formal acknowledgement sent to applicants by email before the winter break.

Upon the acceptance of the Scholarship offer, Scholars will sign a commitment to the program and be informed of orientation, events, and all other information related to the Dornsife Global Development Scholars program. Before committing to this program, it is the responsibility of the student to ensure there are no financial holds or outstanding tuition bills that would impact the posting of their scholarship via Drexel One.
