

ed tragic alcohol poisonings. Dr. Robert Chapman, consultant and educator based in Philadelphia, has been on the receiving end of a 2 a.m. call after a raid on a drinking party at a local hotel. He told the policeman, "If my daughter was drinking, I want you to arrest her. I want her to realize there is that consequence.'

Dr. Peter Delany, research director in Maryland, has studied drinking in young teens, with disturbing findings. An estimated 709,000 youths in the U.S. aged 12 to 14 drank alcohol in the past month, with percent) getting their alcohol for

free the last time they drank. More than 300,000 of the young teens got it at home or from family.

All four men are experts in their fields, dealing with the impact of underage drinking. All are also parents.
