

## **Drexel Graduate Bridge**

The *Drexel Graduate Bridge* is a conditional admission program for students who qualify academically but need to improve their English language proficiency to succeed in graduate school at Drexel University. During a 6 to 12 months program at *Drexel English Language Center*, students study intensive English Language for Academic Purposes (ESL), test preparation, cultural orientation and graduate readiness skills. Upon successful completion of the program, matriculation requirements, and recommendation of the Graduate Bridge advisor, students will qualify to pursue a *Master's degree* at Drexel University in:

## **How to Qualify**

- Meet GPA and undergraduate requirements for your preferred Drexel graduate program.
- **Provide TOEFL or IELTS test score report.** Students are expected to achieve the required test scores for matriculation within 6 months to one year of the Graduate Bridge Program.
- GRE, GMAT or LSAT test scores requirements for application vary per program: (GRE or GMAT is
  required to apply for Graduate Bridge to Business.) Students prepare for and take the exams
  during the Graduate Bridge Program if required for the graduate program matriculation.

- IELTS or TOEFL Test Preparation
- GRE, GMAT or LSAT Test Preparation where required
- Preparation for Graduate education and research

- Peer mentoring, tutoring and advising

## **How to Matriculate to the Graduate Program**

- ✓ Achieve the IELTS or TOEFL score required by the graduate department
- ✓ Achieve the GRE, GMAT or LSAT test scores where required
- ✓ Complete all Graduate Bridge coursework with passing grades and attendance
- ✓ Demonstrate graduate level readiness and responsibility
- ✓ Receive a recommendation for matriculation by your Graduate Bridge advisor

Matriculation to most approved graduate programs is in the Fall, Winter, or Spring terms upon successful completion of the Graduate Bridge Program and the graduate matriculation requirements.
