- **CV/Resume**. Be sure this reflects significant activities in which you've been involved, leadership roles you've had, and any awards, honors, scholarships received.

Nominees will be announced by November 15th, with their completed application draft to be submitted to the campus committee for review and feedback by December 6th. Nominees will meet with the nominating committee twice – once right after exams (Dec 13, 16, or 17) and again in mid-January. Truman's national deadline is Feb 4th.
