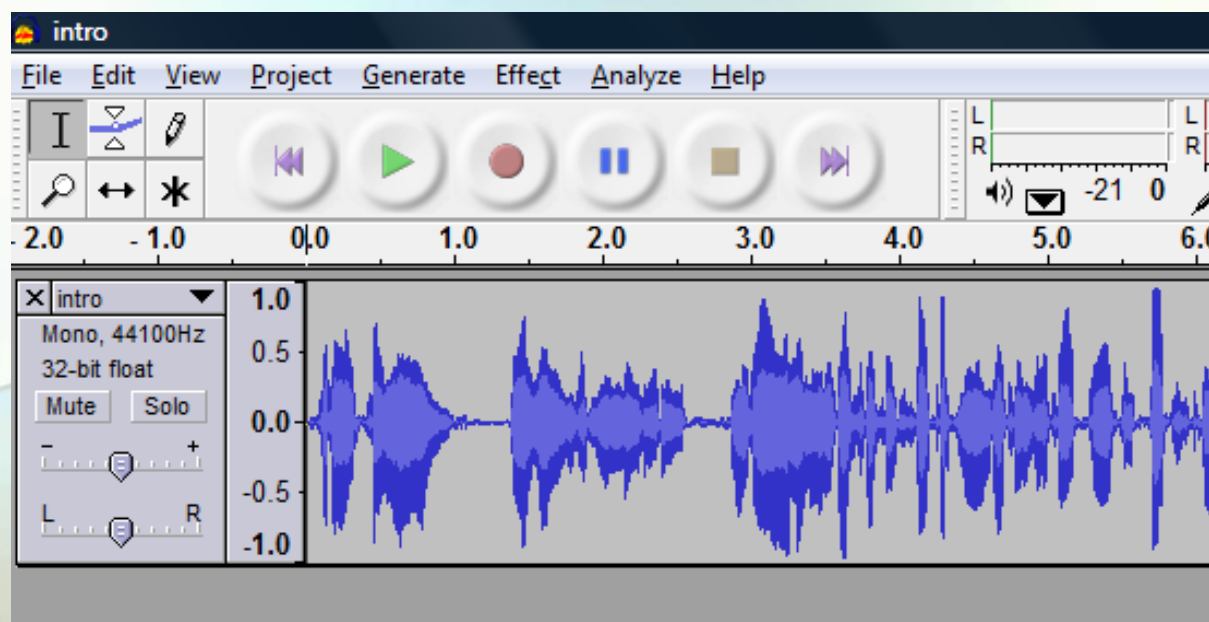






Introduction

Audacity Free Audio Recorder and Editor

- Application and DLL from **<http://audacity.sourceforge.net/>**
 - ✓ Audacity 1.2.6 for Windows
 - ✓ Lame_enc.dll
- Plug in a microphone or headset to computer
- Record

Audacity® Free Audio Recorder and Editor






- Click on the red circle  to record.
- Click on the green arrow  to play.
- Click on the blue vertical lines  to pause.
- Click on the yellow square  to stop.

- Students are motivated

 - ✓ Fosters a sense of achievement in using English for communicative purposes
 - ✓ Develop self-monitoring and modification skills, and recognize language accomplishments
