These scholarships provide housing assistance to students living in the Washington DC area or attend New Jersey institutions and have a disability as defined by the ADA. The amount awarded is typically \$5000.

Award amount is between \$1000 - \$3000.

Amounts awarded range from \$1000 - \$3000 and students must remain in good academic standing and participate in community service.

There are seven distinct scholarships with differing requirements offered through the foundation. Amounts awarded range from \$500 - \$3500.
