Mark Beecher Percussion Ensemble Director



Mark Beecher, has over 30 years of experience, performing and teaching worldwide. Mark attended Widener University, where he performed & toured with their Jazz Ensemble, directed by Woody Herman alumnus, John Vanore. Mark studied with Latin percussion masters Frankie Malabe and Jose Luis 'Changuito' Quintana, and also with African drumming master

Oscar Sulley, Eastern Indian drumming master T.N. Bala, and Frank Zappa drummers, Chad Wackerman & Chester Thompson. Mark has performed on stage with multi-GRAMMY Winners – Shania Twain, The Chieftains, Peter Erskine, and GRAMMY Nominees – Kathy Sledge of Sister Sledge, John Beasley, & Elio Villafranca. Mark has entertained such luminaries as The Rolling Stones, Queen Elizabeth, President Clinton, President Valery Giscard d'Estang of France, and King Carl XVI Gustav of Sweden.

He has recorded over 30 albums with a variety of artists, along with his drum tracks being included on an album in the Billboard Top 10; his creative work has been featured on 2 GRAMMY-Winning, and 3 Nominated Albums. Mark is a voting member of the GRAMMYs (Recording Academy), and is a Spotify Verified Artist, with a number of his own albums available for streaming. Mark has authored a number of published works, including 'The Rudimental Percussionist' and the book, 'I.A.R.P. Rudimental Solos,' as well as his own instructional DVD, 'The Art of Ancient Rudimental Drumming,' which has been endorsed by members of the Philadelphia Orchestra and the Pittsburgh Symphony.

Chris Farrell Experimental Music Ensemble Director



Christopher B. Farrell is an award-winning composer for Red Earth Calling, multi-instrumentalist, producer, and founder of the critically acclaimed instrumental ensemble, the Rit Mo Collective.
Christopher has scored music for over 100 multi-media productions including film, television, dance, and spoken word poetry.

He averages over 150 live performances a year and has performed on five continents during his 33-year career as a musician. As an Educator, Christopher is currently in the Music/Dance faculty at Drexel & Temple Universities and a Dance Accompanist at Swarthmore College. His previous appointments include Accompanist at University of the Arts in Philadelphia (2012-2020), Lecturer at Pontificia Universidad Javeriana in Bogota, Colombia (2018-2019), Excel Summer Music Program Director at UC Santa Cruz (2003) & Oxford University (2001 & 2002), and English Teacher at The UC Berkley affiliated Anglo American School in Bologna, Italy. Interested in a Music Minor?

Drexel offers four different music minors:

<u>Music</u>: requires 26 credits, including work in Music Theory, History, private lessons, ensemble performance, and 9 credits of music electives.

<u>Music Theory and Composition:</u> aimed at people who are writing their own music or who would like to begin doing so. You will take courses in Music Theory, Arranging, Composition, and Digital Composition, and end with a portfolio of several completed pieces.

<u>Music Performance:</u> requires two years of private lesson studies with our artist faculty culminating in a recital. The Music Program will provide support for the recital venue and accompanist.

<u>Jazz & African-American Music:</u> includes course work in Jazz History, African-American Music, Jazz Theory, private study in Jazz performance, and ensemble work in several ensembles devoted to jazz.
