WHAT are Placement Exams?

The placement exams have been developed by Drexel faculty to ensure students are appropriately placed into courses. These examinations assess your proficiency in college level Mathematics, Chemistry, and Modern Languages courses.

HOW do I take my Placement Exam(s)?

Most placement exams are administered online. Please review the Guide to Taking The Placement Examination(s) at http://www.drexel.edu/provost/placement. This guide will instruct you on how to pick up your accounts (if you haven't already done so), configure your computer, and take your required exams. If you are requesting accommodations on the placement examination(s) due to a disability, you must register with the Office of Disability Resources (ODR) prior to receiving testing accommodations. You should plan to register as soon as possible, as the process may take some time.
