



OVERVIEW

A sponsor can fund research projects via different award instruments - assistance or procurement funding mechanisms.

By assistance, we mean financial support in the form of awards, which include grants and cooperative agreements that provide money to fund a project.

Procurement is the process in which a Federal agency acquires something, such as a service. A contract is established to delineate the terms of the exchange.

RULES & REGULATIONS

OMB Circular A-110 Subpart B provides guidance to Federal sponsors to decide what is the most appropriate award instrument.

The <u>Federal Grant and Cooperative</u> <u>Agreement Act (1977)</u> details the distinctions between contracts, cooperative agreements and grants.
