Nominees will be announced by November 15th, with their completed application draft to be submitted to the campus committee for review and feedback by December 5th. Nominees will meet with the nominating committee twice – once right after exams (Dec 14 or 17) and again the week of Jan 22nd. Truman's national deadline is Feb 5th.
