




The End Is the Beginning

The 2011 Drexel University College of Medicine Commencement took place on Friday, May 20, at the Kimmel Center for the Performing Arts. Guests and participants arriving for the ceremony wove their way around and through an 81-foot-tall replica of the Eiffel Tower (installed for the Philadelphia International Festival of the Arts), a spectacular sight that lent a new dimension to this year's photographs. U.S. Surgeon General Regina M. Benjamin, M.D., delivered the

Commencement address, "Making a Difference." The College bestowed upon her the honorary degree of Doctor of Science, for her promotion of preventive medicine and her service to the nation. Also receiving an honorary degree was former U.S. Senator Arlen Specter, who was presented with the degree of Doctor of Humane Letters, in recognition of his contributions to the citizens and law of the nation.


